Declaring God's Grace & Demonstrating God's Love, as Directed by God's Word

### Welcome to Worship!

What a privilege it is to welcome you to Ken Mawr today! We might argue that listening is something we do well. But in Luke 6 Jesus is asking for engagement, for what some call "active listening." Some of the things he asks of us are hard to hear. We might say we don't have enemies, but we live in an oppositional world. There are always folks on the other side, those with whom we disagree. The Lord Jesus challenges us on how we treat them, how we speak to them, and even, how we speak of them. "Love your enemies" isn't something that sits easily in our ears. This entire passage is an example of Jesus' rhetorical style of repeating, "even sinners." If "even sinners" manage to love those who love them back, shouldn't we go the extra mile to love the unlovable, to lend to the unreliable? So, how do we make space for active listening today? Maybe it begins with a commitment to love as Jesus loves, because we need to hear it over and over again—perhaps even from our own lips.


